Nursing care is delivered in a variety of contemporary health care settings. This programme offers a unique opportunity for students to study care delivery within two fields of practice, Learning Disability and Child, and is structured to give you a range of theory and practice modules in both fields.

Year 1

Values and Rights based Nursing practice, Health Improvement, Contemporary Health Care Delivery, Introduction to Evidence Based Practice.

Year 2

Working in interprofessional teams. Promoting personal outcomes for people with learning disabilities.

Year 3

Applying evidence based practice. Context of care for children/young people and their families.

Year 4

Honours level dissertation, Leadership in Interprofessional teams, Learning disability and child and adolescent mental health, Advancing the Application of Values Based Nursing Practice in Health and Social Care.
