We've strong links with conservation and environmental management employers giving you the opportunity to get hands-on experience of working with business partners during your degree.

In the outdoor education components you'll get to learn from some of the UK's top mountaineering instructors and outdoor educators. The optional but included Summer Mountain Leader Award requires that you must complete a minimum of 40 quality mountain days.
