It will capitalise on the existing strengths of medical teaching in the Universities of St Andrews and Dundee in collaboration with NHS Fife, NHS Tayside, NHS Highland, NHS Dumfries and Galloway and the University of the Highlands and Islands.

GAMSAT test must be completed in year of application. Interviews will follow a Multiple Mini Interview format and will be conducted at the University of Dundee.
