There is an emphasis on leadership skills and the application of evidence based medicine to plan and drive change in critical care. In addition to clinical topics, the programme explores non-clinical areas such as Audit and Quality Improvement amongst others.

Successful completion will lead to the award of a postgraduate degree that would be excellent for personal development and a stepping stone for career progression.
