Content

Year 1

You will study the history, politics and culture of classical Athens and Augustan Rome. You will use a wide variety of source material, including buildings, coins, artefacts and literary works such as epic poems and plays alongside historical texts.

Year 2

You will study Greek cities, communities and kingdoms and the wider Mediterranean world in the build-up to Alexander the Great's world-changing conquests in the fourth century and their aftermath in the Hellenistic period.

You will also study the Roman Empire by considering literary, historical and material evidence (including historians such as Tacitus and Suetonius) to investigate issues of identity and power across the empire as well as the lived experience of its inhabitants (including topics such as slavery, gender, language, religion, education, disability).

Years 3 and 4

If you progress to Honours (years 3 and 4), you will choose from a wide variety of options in ancient history that reflects current key issues, debates and research on the ancient world. These could include, for example, courses in ancient medicine, ancient technology, Athenian democracy, Roman history from the Gracchi to Sulla, Greek religion, the 'invention of history' by Herodotus, Thucydides and Xenophon, Cleopatra (her life and legend), and the fall of the Roman Empire.
