Horticulture is a very important sector of the Scottish economy, with more than 1,500 businesses and approximately 7,500 employees (Lantra: "Horticulture, landscaping and sports turf factsheet). The land-based sector is responsible for much of Scotland's food exports. It needs suitably trained and qualified staff with the knowledge and skills to meet the fast moving horticultural economy.
