The SWAP Access to Humanities programme is designed to help you get ready for university even if you've been away from education for many years. Successful completion also provides you with a qualification for entry to university. Our partners include:

Glasgow Caledonian University (GCU); University of Glasgow; University of Stirling; University of Strathclyde; University of the West of Scotland (UWS).

What you will learn:

A range of social science subjects, including psychology, sociology, history, politics, geography, and philosophy; Communications (English) and literature at Higher level; National 5 Application of Maths; and, Preparation for Higher Education (Prep for HE), including support to develop ICT and academic research skills.

Assessment types include essays, reports, class-based tests, group discussions and presentations at the end of each unit, rather than big exams at the end of the year.
