Content

Psychology is an experimental and observational science. It uses evidence from research studies to develop and evaluate theories. Studying business will prepare you for the different challenges affecting contemporary businesses, governments and not-for-profit organisations.

Year 1:

You will receive a general introduction to psychology in your first year, covering biological, social and developmental psychology, the psychology of memory and perception, individual differences and language and thinking. You will also learn about research methods and use statistics in psychology.

You will take two business courses Global Challenges for Business and The Business of Edinburgh.

Year 2:

You will continue to study the core areas of psychology, along with neuropsychology, abnormal, and historical psychology, and you will develop your research skills by practising statistics and running practical experiments.

You will choose three option courses from a range of business disciplines, such as finance, marketing, business analytics and human resource management.

Year 3:

You will take an advanced tutorial course to help you critically analyse psychology research papers. You will take advanced courses in the core areas required for British Psychology Society accreditation (social, developmental, biological, cognitive and differential psychology) and carry out a literature review and a group research project in one of these core areas.

In business, you will take courses in Strategic Management and Research in Management.

Year 4:

Most students can choose from a range of specialised, research-led options. These include Clinical Neuropsychology; Human Cognitive Abilities; Memory, Ageing and the Brain; Causes and Consequences of Personality; Children with Language Impairments; and Social Judgement and Decision-Making. In business, you will choose at least two more specialist honours courses in key areas of business.

You will complete an honours dissertation in either psychology or business.

Widening access entry:

4 Highers at ABBB (two sittings) including 1 from Maths (or Applications of Maths), Biology (or Human Biology), Chemistry, Computing Science, Geography, Physics, or Psychology plus English at National 5 at C and Maths at A or Maths and Physics at B. Highers at BBB must be achieved in one sitting.
