

## Architectural Studies

### Content

Year 1:

Design Studies 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D: The first design studio project will introduce you to the whole of the architectural design process: from conceptualisation and inception, through design development and resolution, to full size realisation and construction. Subsequent projects will develop design methodologies to enable you to design your first building. Further Year 1 classes are Experiencing Architecture, Cultural Studies 1 and Technology Studies 1.

Year 2:

Design Studies 2A, 2B, 2C: You'll work on a series of increasingly complex architectural projects set in a Scottish context, which are supported by the Experiencing Architecture 2 programme. Further Year 2 classes are Cultural Studies 2, Technology Studies 2 and Elective Class.

Year 3:

Design Studies 3A, 3B: you'll undertake two projects in a dense urban context, the latter project being an undergraduate thesis. Further Year 3 classes are Cultural Studies 3, Technology Studies 3 and Introduction to Practice.

Year 4:

You'll complete the Design Studies programme with classes 4A and 4B. The Cultural Studies 4 class will assist you in producing your final-year dissertation, working on an area of your own interest. The Special Study Project 4 allows Architectural Studies students to further the aims and outcomes of one of the key areas of the syllabus. This project is intended to link between taught coursework and potential Masters' projects.
