Archaeology at Aberdeen has a special northern focus that is unique in the UK. Through lectures, field and laboratory work you will engage with the archaeology of Scotland, Scandinavia, northern Europe, the North Atlantic and northern latitudes of Asia and North America. You will be taught by internationally acclaimed researchers.

Fourth Year (Senior Honours): Archaeological Research Project Part 2; Current Issues in Archaeology; Bioarchaeology: Biological Approaches in Archaeology; A choice of specialist Archaeology courses.
