Subjects include: Stage 1 of the 3 Stage Intergrative Model; Stage 2 of the 3 Stage Intergrative Model; Stage 3 of the 3 Stage Intergrative Model; Humanistic Counselling Approaches; Behavioural and Cognitive Counselling Approaches; Psychodynamic Counselling Approaches; Understanding Addictive Behaviours; Working with Addictive Behaviours; Working with Substance Abuse; Group Counselling Skills; Theory Loss, Grief and Bereavement; Graded Unit.

Non-assessed practical experience within a helping agency or organisation that allows for the supervised practice of counselling skills is encouraged during the course.
