Why study Drama?

Drama gives you the opportunity to use your imagination and express yourself in a creative and practical way. It helps you to develop important skills such as problem solving, communication, planning and creative thinking. It is particularly suitable for those who love being creative, getting their ideas across in a dramatic way and communicating their ideas with others.

The skills that you develop in Drama are useful in many different careers, including: communications and media, theatre, film, TV, radio, costume design, production, writing and teaching.

What do I need to get in?

This is at the discretion of the school or college but you would normally be expected to have:

- **National 5 Drama**

What will I study?

During this course you will:

- respond to stimuli, including text, when creating drama
- work with others to share and use drama ideas
- develop knowledge and understanding of historical, social, cultural and theatrical influences when creating drama
- explore drama form, structure, genre and style
- gain knowledge and understanding of complex production skills
- apply complex drama and production skills when presenting
- apply evaluative skills within the creative process.

How will I be assessed?

The course assessment has **two** components **totalling 100 marks**:

- Component 1: question paper – worth 40 marks
- Component 2: performance – worth 60 marks.

For the performance component, you will be asked to prepare a performance. The performance section can be either as the role of:

- actor – performing two interactive acting roles, each from a different play; or
- director – directing an extract of text; or
- designer – create a set design concept for a chosen text, and choose one other relevant production role for the whole play (either from lighting, sound, props, costume, or make-up and hair).

The performance component will be set by your school or college and externally marked by the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA).

The performance component will be assessed by an SQA visiting assessor.

The question paper will be set and externally marked by SQA.

The grade awarded is based on the total marks achieved across course assessment.

The course assessment is graded A-D.
