Why study Mandarin (Traditional)?

Learning a new language allows you to connect with different people and their cultures. You think, communicate and create ideas through language.

Mandarin is the national language in China and Chinese is the most widely spoken language in the world. China is also the second largest economy in the world. So, learning Mandarin gives you a distinct advantage when travelling or doing business with China or other Mandarin-speaking areas.

The skills that you learn in Mandarin are useful for working in areas such as business and commerce, travel and tourism and teaching.

What do I need to get in?

The school or college will decide on the entry requirements for the course. You would normally have achieved:

What will I study?

This course gives you the chance to improve your skills in reading, listening, talking and writing in Mandarin (Traditional), important for learning, work and life. You will also learn to understand how language works and how to get across information and ideas.

You will study a wide range of different types of texts in different media.

You will also learn to think critically and creatively and develop cultural awareness.

The course has **two** compulsory units plus an **added value** unit that assesses your practical skills.

Mandarin (Traditional): Understanding Language (9 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- develop reading and listening skills in Mandarin
- develop your knowledge of straightforward Mandarin in the contexts of society, learning, employability and culture.

Mandarin (Traditional): Using Language (9 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- develop talking and writing skills in Mandarin

- develop your knowledge of straightforward Mandarin in the contexts of society, learning, employability and culture.

Added Value Unit: Mandarin (Traditional) Assignment (6 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- select relevant information from at least two written texts
- give a verbal presentation in Mandarin, and respond appropriately to questions in Mandarin.

How will I be assessed?

Your work will be assessed by your teacher or tutor on a regular basis throughout the course. Items of work might include:

- practical work – reading, speaking or listening to texts
- written work – producing simple texts
- class-based exams.

You must pass both units plus the added value unit to gain the course qualification.
