Why study Media?

The media plays a central role in our world. It affects society at all levels, from economics, politics, community, culture and individual.

In this course you will analyse the media and its role in everyday life. You will develop your analytical and critical skills through looking at various examples of texts from newspapers, TV, film, radio or the internet. And, you will improve your creative and expressive skills when you learn to create your own media content.

The skills you learn in this course are useful in many career areas. This includes writing, the performing arts, journalism and publishing.

What do I need to get in?

The school or college will decide on the entry requirements for the course.

What will I study?

This course aims to help you improve your critical and creative skills through looking at and creating media content. You will learn to look at things like film posters, websites, film, radio or TV adverts in a critical way. And, you will get to know key concepts of media, such as language, representation, narrative, audience and categories. Creating media content is a big part of this course where you might produce work using a camera or computer. You will be aware of the opportunities and challenges going on in the media industry.

The course has **two** compulsory units.

- learn the skills to study media content
- learn key concepts of media to help you study simple media content: categories, language, representation, narrative, audience and institution.
