What will I study?

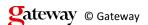
People and Society helps you to develop an open mind and respect for the values, beliefs and cultures of others. You will study themes drawn from social subjects and social sciences. Topics include behaviour, citizenship, diversity, environment, equality, and technology. You will find out some of the consequences of the ways people behave in society.

The course has three compulsory units.

Investigating Skills (6 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

• learn how to choose sources of information for investigation, select and collect information





• choose ideas to study that will develop your knowledge and understanding of people and society.

Comparing and Contrasting (6 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- learn how to use information to compare and contrast
- choose ideas to study that will develop your knowledge and understanding of people and society.

Making Decisions (6 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- learn how to use information to make decisions
- choose ideas to study that will develop your knowledge and understanding of people and society.

Note: All units may be taken with a Scottish Context option, which contributes towards the Scottish Studies Award.

Your work will be assessed by your teacher or tutor on an ongoing basis throughout the course. You must pass all three units to gain the course qualification.
