What do I need to get in?

Entry is at the discretion of the school or college. You should be working at SCQF level 4 when undertaking these units, particularly in English or Communications.

What will I study?

The course is made up of three compulsory units and one optional unit from a choice of three, each one taking 40 hours of study.

The compulsory units are:

- Child Development
- Play in Early Learning and Childcare
- Working in Early Learning and Childcare

The optional units are

- Contemporary Families
- Care of Children
- Maintenance of a Safe Environment for Children





You will learn about:

- looking after children
- different types of play and the importance of play
- factors affecting child development
- the responsibilities of being a parent
- practical child care such as preparing food and bathing children
- health and safety legislation.

Where will I take the course?

You will usually train at a local college. Training sessions will take place for a set number of hours and weeks during term time.

Work experience/placements

 You may be able to arrange a related work experience placement by speaking to your pastoral care or guidance.

How will I be assessed?

Assessment in this Course will be based on a range of practical workshop activities, supported by assessor observation checklists and candidate self-checking of quality.
