Entry is at the discretion of the school or college.

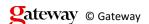
### What will I study?

The course is made up of five compulsory units, three taking 40 hours and two taking 20 hours of study:

- An Introduction (6 SCQF credit points) **OR** An Introduction Scotland (6 SCQF credit points)
- Roles and Responsibilities (6 SCQF credit points)
- Health Awareness (6 SCQF credit points)
- Working Safely (6 SCQF credit points)
- Life Sciences Industry (3 SCQF credit points)

- the basic structure and function of the main body systems
- measuring physiological changes in body function

#### Where will I take the course?

You will usually train at a local college. Training sessions will take place for a set number of hours and weeks during term time.
