
What will I study?

The course is made up of five compulsory units, three taking 40 hours and two taking 20 hours of study:

- Working in Health Sector Settings OR Working in Health Sector Settings Scotland (6 SCQF credit points)
- Employability Skills in the Health Sector (6 SCQF credit points)
- Medical Devices and Pharmaceuticals (3 SCQF credit points)
- Improving health and Wellbeing (6 SCQF credit points)
- Physiology of the Cardiovascular System (3 SCQF credit points)

You will learn about

- the diverse range of both clinical and non-clinical roles
- practice customer care skills in a clinical and non-clinical role





- job seeking skills and how to prepare for specific roles including mock interviews
- learn about different medical devices and how they diagnose and treat patients
- investigate the use of pharmaceutical products for medical conditions
- tackle current health and lifestyle issues through teamwork
- the structure and function of the cardiovascular system.

Where will I take the course?

You will usually train at a local college. Training sessions will take place for a set number of hours and weeks during term time.

How will I be assessed?

Assessment will be based on a range of practical activities in real or simulated workplace settings. Tutors will observe and keep records of your work.
