Why study ESOL?

Language and literacy skills are important in your personal, social and working life. And, you need good language skills for self-expression, thinking and learning.

What do I need to get in?

What will I study?

This course will help you get the right skills for learning English as a second language. You will learn how to read, write, listen and speak in a variety different situations and settings. Your critical and creative thinking skills will also improve as well your cultural awareness.

The course has **two** compulsory units.

ESOL for Everyday Life (9 SCQF credit points)

In this unit you will:

- develop language skills needed for everyday life in routine personal, social and work-related settings
- develop skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking using simple English language.

ESOL in Context (9 SCQF credit points)

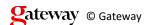
In this unit you will:

- develop language skills needed for routine work and study related settings
- develop skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking using simple English language. This unit can be suited to meet your personal needs.

How will I be assessed?

Your teacher or tutor will assess your work on a regular basis throughout the course. Items of work might include:

- practical work reading, speaking or listening to texts
- written work producing simple texts.
